Why do I need a nurse?

You may not have any health problems but your nurse will answer questions about your pregnancy and taking care of your baby.

What about my privacy?

The nurse doesn't pry into your personal life. She only responds if you bring it up.

What if my house is not clean?

The nurse doesn't look at how clean your house is. She is there to help you, not judge you.

How long are visits?

Each visit last about 1 to 1½ hrs.



Getting to know you.

When you join the program, your nurse will visit you every week for the first four weeks.

What happens during my pregnancy?

Your nurse will visit you every other week. She'll help you understand what to expect and how you and your baby can have the best possible health.

What happens after my baby is born?

Your nurse will visit you every week for the first six weeks to help you learn how to care for your infant.

How long does this program last?

As your baby grows your nurse will visit every other week until your baby is 21 months old, and then visit you once a month until your baby is two. Your nurse will be there to help with problems, answer questions and give you information on raising a healthy, happy child.

What is VORP?

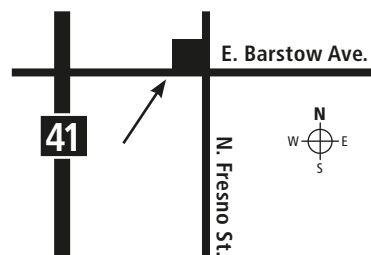
